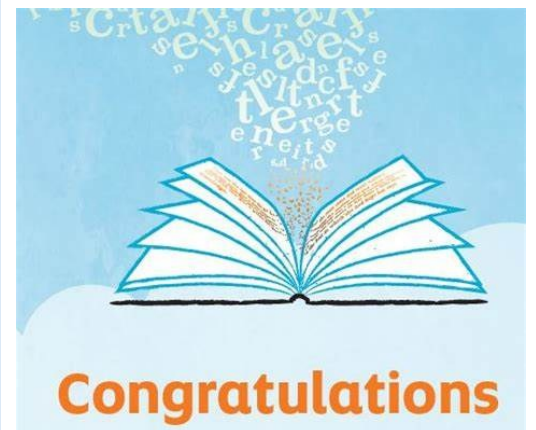

FOOD DELIVERIES

*We will be ACTIVE

Since the Summer holidays , our school has been receiving deliveries from The Felix Project, a United Kingdom charity that saves surplus food from shops and gives it to charities and other organisations, such as schools.

Our deliveries arrive on a Friday morning, then staff and parent volunteers sort it out ready for collection.

In our deliveries, we receive mainly fruit and vegetables that would otherwise go to waste; we can never tell what is going to turn up, sometimes we have crates of carrots, other times it's boxes of bananas.

The delivery usually comes at about 9.30am, but we always send a message to parents to say that it's arrived.

We bag up for a small number of families who are unable to get here in the morning, apart from that you need to bring your own bag and then help yourself to the fruit and veg that you need. We sometimes get small amounts of other items, such as bread and juice; for these we ask that you take just 1 of these items per family so we can share it out fairly.

We have deliveries every week during term time, and also sometimes in the holidays- we always text to let you know.
