





What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ROBLOX

Roblox is one of the most popular video games among children. In 2020, the game's developers claimed that more than half of the UK's children had played it. As a 'sandbox' title, the game lets players create their own gaming experiences with Roblox Studio to build custom levels, which can then be shared online.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- ONLINE PLAY RISKS**
Because Roblox connects random players across the world, it can be a social playground in an unpredictable way. Parents and educators should be aware that children could use the platform for inappropriate reasons. For example, some may play games on the site for online dates and in-game play, which could expose your child to inappropriate messages in the public chat box.
- MATURE CONTENT**
Content is difficult to moderate throughout Roblox, due to the number of games available. This is particularly notable on smaller games and experiences, but in general, some of the games and experiences offered on the platform contain age-inappropriate content that could easily be seen by young players.
- IN-GAME SPENDING**
The majority of games within Roblox have an in-game monetisation system, usually through season passes or microtransactions. Purchases can range in value from a few pence up to much larger sums of money. While some games offer a lot of content for purchase, others can offer very little for real world money, causing younger players to end up in debt.

ADVICE FOR PARENTS & EDUCATORS

- MONITOR THE CONTENT**
While Roblox does implement plenty of moderation tools and parental controls, it's up to parents and educators to monitor the types of games a child is engaging with. If a youngster wants to play Roblox, be sure to check out which specific games they want to play within it, and get a good idea of their content.
- TAKE ADVANTAGE OF TOOLS**
Use the parental controls within the game itself and teach youngsters how to report and block other players. Knowing the parents within their friends list will make it easier to report and block. You can also report and block players who are offering to coach, trade, or give items. These options are helpful in cutting off bad players from engaging with your child.
- PLAY TOGETHER**
Consider playing Roblox with the children in your care. There are a few more effective ways to see how moderation works. Group whether the game could lead to obsessive behaviour, or even appears how inappropriate behaviour is reported. This can help you to see if the game is particularly risky for your child.
- TEACH ONLINE BEHAVIOURS**
Have an open conversation about the risks of online play and how to spend money wisely. By using in-game money, you can see how the game could lead to obsessive behaviour, or even appears how inappropriate behaviour is reported. SCAMS
Many of the games on Roblox feature collectible items, such as avatars, hats, and accessories. These digital items are worth a lot of real money. In certain cases, scammers will attempt to trick children into giving up their items for a small amount of real money. Be sure to teach your child about the risks of giving up items for real money, and how to report and block players who are offering to buy items for real money.
