Dear Families,

As you know, our focus on attendance continues. Every child will receive their attendance update letter today, which is sent out at the end of each half term. Every day in school counts, and we hope that seeing the sessions your child has attended and missed is helpful. Congratulations to everyone who has over 95% attendance, and to those whose attendance has improved over the last half term.

Our Spring Attendance Challenge begins on Monday 2nd March. Every child with attendance of 95% or above for the month of March, and who is in school on the last day of term, will be entered into a prize draw to win one of four £25 Amazon vouchers. Good luck!

Our whole-school attendance for this year currently stands at 93%, up from 92% at this time last year. (our aim is for 95% in line with national average) We want every child to be in school, on time, every day so they can make the most of their learning. A child spends 1,295 days in school from Reception to Year 6 - let's make every one of them count.





We continue to work behind the scenes to improve the traffic situation on Owen Road. Following two dangerous incidents, we wrote again to Hillingdon who replied with the following:

Good afternoon,

Thank you for your email and for continuing to highlight the dangerous driving and inconsiderate parking issues on Owen Road. We are sorry to hear about the ongoing situation and appreciate you bringing the most recent incident to our attention.



We will pass the details of this incident to our parking enforcement team and ask whether they are able to increase their visits to the school on a temporary basis. As you can appreciate, the borough has a relatively small team of enforcement officers covering over 100 schools across Hillingdon. Officers therefore attend schools on a rota basis, with the aim of visiting each school at least once a week. We recognise that this is not ideal, but it reflects current capacity constraints. Nevertheless, we will request increased monitoring at Owen Road where possible.

In terms of actions at the school level, we would like to thank you for your continued efforts to promote sustainable travel and road safety. We are aware of the positive work being undertaken by the school, including engagement with parents, encouragement of “park and stride,” and the initiatives led by the school’s travel ambassadors. These soft measures play an important role alongside enforcement.

From the council’s perspective, we have been reviewing a range of longer-term options for Owen Road. As you will recall, a voluntary one-way system was previously explored and supported by the school and parents, but did not receive very much support from residents. Following further assessment, we have now developed a proposed consultation presenting three options:

School Street – *A timed restriction on Owen Road during peak school periods to reduce traffic outside the school and improve safety for pupils and families. Residents of Owen Road and school staff would be exempt from the restrictions.*

Permanent One-Way System – *This option proposes entry via Ayles Road. Initial modelling suggests this could result in traffic displacement onto nearby roads within the London Borough of Ealing, and we are therefore engaging with Ealing Council as part of this assessment.*

Parking Management Scheme – *Subject to feasibility work and resident engagement, a localised parking management approach could be introduced to help address congestion and inconsiderate parking during peak times.*

These three options were presented this morning to our Cabinet Member, Cllr Steve Tuckwell, who has approved progressing to a formal consultation with residents of Owen Road and the surrounding area. *Consultation materials are now being prepared and we expect these to be issued within the next few weeks. We will keep you updated once a confirmed date is available.*

In addition, Owen Road was of course reduced to a 20mph speed limit last year, which will further support improved safety in the area surrounding the school.

Thank you again for your ongoing engagement and for continuing to raise these important concerns. We will update you as soon as we have more information.
