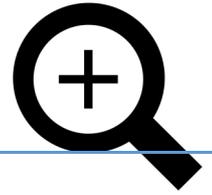

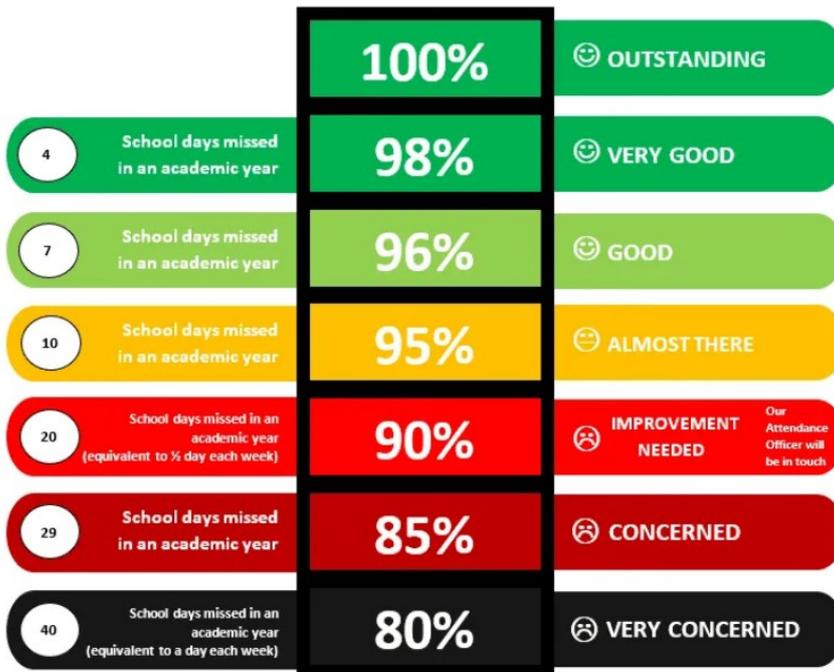

RADICALISATION AWARENESS SESSIONS

Parent sessions

Young people today are exposed to a constant stream of online content from influencers and meme pages to extremist groups who hide behind seemingly harmless posts. These sessions help parents understand how extremist narratives spread, how young people can be drawn in through emotional or social pressures, and how families can create safe, supportive environments that build resilience. Parents will learn practical ways to spot early warning signs, support healthy online habits, and confidently challenge harmful content.

Aims

- To increase parents' awareness of how extremist narratives circulate online and offline.
- To strengthen parents' confidence in supporting their children to think critically about what they see online.
- To help parents understand the emotional, social, and identity-based factors that can make young people vulnerable to extremist influence.
- To empower parents to feel more confident discussing sensitive topics such as radicalisation, hate, and misinformation.
- To promote safer online habits within families and encourage healthier digital engagement.

Objectives

- Equip parents with practical tools to identify early warning signs of harmful online content or behavioural changes.
- Provide guidance on how to support young people to stay safe online, including managing algorithms, privacy settings, and content exposure.
- Improve parents' ability to recognise push and pull factors influencing youth vulnerability (e.g., loneliness, identity search, online echo chambers).
- Strengthen parents' confidence in responding appropriately, including when and how to seek advice, support, or make referrals.
- Encourage positive communication strategies so parents can have open, non-confrontational conversations with young people about conflict, hate, and extremism.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ROBLOX

Roblox is one of the most popular video games among children. In 2020, the game's developers claimed that more than half of the UK's children had played it. As a 'sandbox' title, the game lets players create their own gaming experiences with Roblox Studio to build custom levels, which can then be shared online.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- ONLINE PLAY RISKS**
Because Roblox connects random players across the world, it can be a social playground in an unpredictable way. Some users are not who they seem. Parents should be aware that children could use the platform for inappropriate reasons. For example, some may play games on chat for online dates and intimate play, which could expose your children to inappropriate messages in the public chat box.
- MATURE CONTENT**
Content is difficult to moderate throughout Roblox, due to the number of games available. This is particularly notable on smaller games and experiences, but in general, some of the games and experiences offered on the platform contain age-inappropriate content that could easily be seen by young players.
- IN-GAME SPENDING**
The majority of games within Roblox have an in-game monetisation system, usually through season passes or microtransactions. Purchases can range in value from a few pence up to much larger sums of money. While some games offer a lot of content for purchase, others can offer very little for real world money, causing younger players to end up in debt.

ADVICE FOR PARENTS & EDUCATORS

- MONITOR THE CONTENT**
While Roblox does implement plenty of moderation tools and parental controls, it's up to parents and teachers to monitor the types of games a child is progressing through. If a youngster wants to play Roblox, be sure to check out which specific games they want to play within it, and get a good idea of their content.
- PLAY TOGETHER**
Consider playing Roblox with the children in your care. There are a few more effective ways to see how moderation works. Group whether the game could lead to obsessive behaviour, or even explore how interactions between players work. Some parents/teachers can also explore how interactions should help you figure out whether it's suitable for particular children.
- TAKE ADVANTAGE OF TOOLS**
Use the parental controls within the game itself and teach youngsters how to report and block other players. Knowing the parents within their friends will make it easier to report and block. Some games also have chat filters that can be used to block out inappropriate language, and even filter out bad words from engaging with the game. All these options are helpful in cutting off bad habits from engaging with the game.
- TEACH ONLINE BEHAVIOURS**
Have an open conversation about the risks of online play and how to spend money wisely. By using in-game money, you can see how it's used and how it's spent. Any user can be reported to Roblox moderators by other players for behaving inappropriately. With this knowledge, younger players can be aware of what to look for and help prevent it.
