

Maths:

In maths we will be continuing working on our times tables ready for the MTC check in June. We will also be working on the key arithmetic skills—Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division reinforcing the strategies that we have taught so far this year and those the children have practised in previous years too. We will be continuing to put more practice sheets—both times tables and arithmetic - on Class Dojo for your child to practise.

Things to create for Dojo points:

- Things to create: A menu for a French restaurant,
- Electricity Diary: Keep a record of all the things in the house that use electricity. Consider if there are any ways that you can save electricity.
- Safety Poster: Design a poster about electrical safety tips.
- Create a mind map detailing what you know/think you know about electricity.

 Throughout the term, add the new information that you learn to your mind map.
- Create your own quiz about a topic that we have covered this year in Science we can complete the quiz in school!
- Create your own time tables quiz/game to help people practise their times tables
- After your grown ups at home have done the shopping, play a shopping game and calculate the total cost of some of the items.
- Write a poem about celebrating people's differences.
- Imagine you are a Viking arriving in Britain —describe your journey as you travel to Britain. What do you see? What do you encounter?
- Things to create: Model of a Viking house/Viking longboat
- Imagine you are a Viking- write a diary entry about your typical day.
- Practise asking for food in a French restaurant—videos below to help you
- Practise saying the names of French foods
