- 'Revolutionary Robots and Mighty Machines' a unit that delves into the uses of technology and machinery.

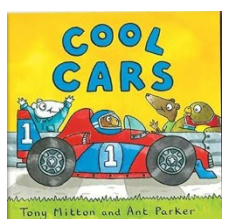
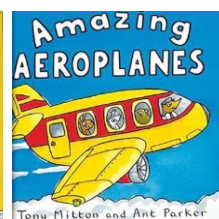
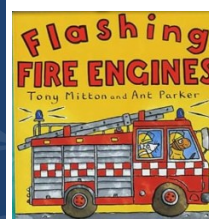
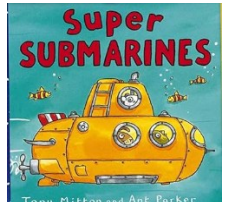
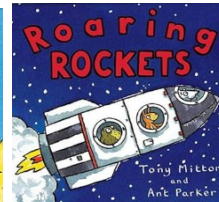
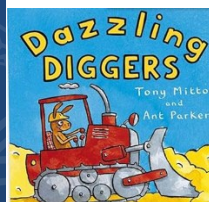
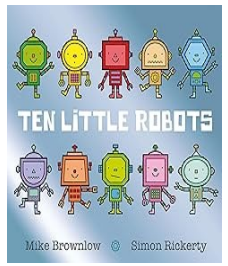
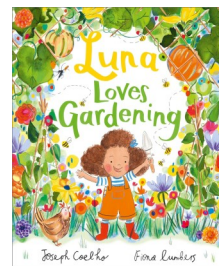
## Books we are sharing in school:

### Maths:

- Continue to learn a range of number-based nursery rhymes.
- Practice subitising (being able to visually see a number of objects without counting them out one at a time).
- Practice matching numbers to quantities.
- Explore the properties of a range of 2D shapes (triangle, square, rectangle, circle).

### Things to create for Dojo points:



- Read a story at home and retell your favourite part in class.
- Create a piece of art inspired by your favourite plant or flower.
- Design your own robot.
- Take a photo of you gardening or planting your own seeds.
- Have fun creating and playing with playdough.
- Learn a new nursery rhyme.

- Feed the ducks at your local park.
- Go fruit-picking and then help make a fruit smoothie.
