New Behaviour Policy

Celebrating success

So the last part of the changes to the behavior policy are the consequences which happen when children don't make the right choices. Children are learning how and when to do the right thing and we allow and support this by having clear expectations and appropriate follow up when rules haven't been followed. We want children to learn, as in life, there are consequences when we make the wrong choices.

For some children with additional needs, they will have an adapted version laid out in a behavior plan so that the consequences are appropriate for them and their needs.

It's been great getting feedback from so many of you in the playground so please do keep talking to me about it. I was very pleased to add 2 parent suggestions to our rules. You can talk to any of the Senior Staff on duty or email the school office enquiries@belmore.school

We are proud to be part of the Belmore community where we have high expectations to represent the school positively.

We have a positive mind-set and even when we are faced with challenges we -



Recognise that everyone is different and we value and encourage them



Use kind words and actions. No swearing, racist, abusive or inappropriate language. No hurting others, fighting or play fighting



Are polite and use good manners



Listen and follow school adults instructions wherever we are



Make sure we are where we are supposed to be, ready to learn



Move around school calmly and safely



Look after our school, classrooms and playgrounds, and everything in them



Speak up when something isn't right



We are honest, take responsibility for our actions and choices and understand that they have consequences

The consequences when things don't go right. Tiers may be skipped depending on the behaviour

Tier 1.

Yellow card

Red card

We will support children by reminding them what they need to be doing, they might need to change spaces or go for a movement break

Parents/Carers are not informed at this level

Tier 2.

Time out in Partner class for the rest of the session

This supports children by removing them from the situation which may be causing the behaviour. We will support them by talking to them about what might help.

Parents/Carers will be informed by Class Dojo from September

Tier 3.

Time out with the Pastoral Team. Senior Leaders or Head Teacher

We will support children by talking through what has happened across the day. Additional support may be planned going forward.

Parents/Carers will receive a phone call

Tier 4.

At this point the Head Teacher will talk with the other staff involved to work out appropriate next steps. This may be:

- an internal or external suspension
- removal of privileges e.g. a school trip
- Report card which is signed by the teacher at the end of every lesson
