

Why is it important?

- The online world develops and changes at great speed. New opportunities, challenges and risks are appearing all the time. This can make it difficult for schools to stay up to date with the latest devices, platforms, apps, trends and related threats.
- It is therefore important to focus on the underpinning knowledge and behaviours that can help pupils to navigate the online world safely and confidently regardless of the device, platform or app. This teaching could be built into existing lessons across the curriculum, covered within specific online safety lessons and/or school wide approaches. Teaching must always be age and developmentally appropriate. (National Curriculum, Paragraph 19-20 P.6)

- 1. Has created **e-safety policies** and **procedures** that will help staff and children mitigate any risk and respond to concerns.
- 2. Is ensuring all staff have the **knowledge to teach** students about e-safety through professional development training and through the NOS courses.

- 4. Reviews and updates the e-safety provision on an ongoing basis.




