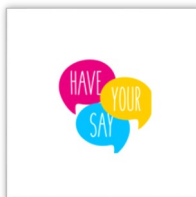

Message from Miss Taunt

Dear Families,

It's that time of year again when we carry out our annual Ofsted Parent Survey. Each year, we use questions provided by Ofsted, and it is extremely important that we gather your feedback on how we are performing as a school so that we can continue to improve. Last year, we received 139 responses - just over 25% of our school community. This year, we would love to hear from even more of you. The survey is quick and should take no more than five minutes to complete.

Children will receive a letter next Friday, 12th June, informing them of their class teacher for the next academic year. Following this, they will take part in weekly sessions with their new teacher to help them become familiar and confident ahead of the transition day on Tuesday, 7th July.
