Message from Miss Taunt

Dear Families,

Well, this has certainly been an unusual week! I absolutely hate closing the school. It goes against almost everything I try to do as a head Teacher, with the exception of keeping children safe. With temperatures in classrooms nearing 40 degrees Celsius, it was not safe to expose children and staff to those temperatures, hence why we have closed for the last three days. The staff have all been working hard from home, taking advantage of the extra days to plan lots of exciting learning for September. We can't wait for cooler temperatures to return next week so we can all get back to normal.

The school will have normal opening and closing times from Monday; all clubs will be running and trips and visits will go ahead as planned. We have a number of events rearranged from last week, and we will confirm slots for the reception and nursery sports day shortly.

We are already planning how we can install air conditioning across the school so that we aren't in this situation next year, as I'm sure we will see more episodes of extreme hot weather going forward. Thank you for all your support during these days, whether you have been trying to arrange childcare or juggling multiple hot, irritable children—thank you!

Thank you to all the families who completed the parent survey. It's so useful to get your perspective on what we are doing well and what we need to work on, and this will feed into our school development plan for next year. I have added a summary of the results on page 3.

We also surveyed teachers at the same time: 87% of staff said they are proud to work at Belmore, and 88% said the school is well led and well managed. 98% of staff say that pupils are safe at this school, and 98% said the school is effective in supporting pupils' wellbeing. We will be sharing more of our staff survey results on our Instagram page.

As you know, we are continuously looking to improve, so having this feedback from both staff and families is really useful as we make plans for next year.

I hope you manage to stay cool this weekend, and we can't wait to see you all on Monday at 8.35.
